Hispanic Heritage Month displays and activities are planned for October

Film, literature and music will star in the celebration of Hispanic Heritage Month at the library. A film series will be offered on Tuesday evenings at 6:30 pm beginning October 5. On display on the second floor are items that represent Puerto Rico and Latin America. *Hispanic People and Events on U.S. Postage Stamps* is a biography-rich exhibit in the third floor display area. Children are invited to create their own stamp or guess the country's flag in the Children's Room, and to learn about Hispanic Americans who are featured in Children's Room Theater area. The Elizabeth Local History Room is also gathering stories of Elizabeth residents of Hispanic ancestry. Stories are welcome in English or Spanish. Details are available at the Reference Desk.

Annual Noontime Concert Series will open October 14th

The Fall Noontime Concert Series will open during Hispanic Heritage Month this year.

Three-D Ritmo de Vida will open the series with a tropical mix of salsa and Caribbean soul on Thursday, October 14th at noon. Kean University will present *A Classical Guitar and Piano Studio Showcase* on October 21st. Musicians from Rutgers University's Mason Gross School of the Arts will appear on October 28th. The closing concert will be Westfield Symphony Orchestra artists, violinist Evelyn Estava and pianist Shuang Guo, who will perform light jazz. Coffee, tea and light refreshments are provided. Bag or box lunches are welcome in the auditorium. Funding for this program has been made possible in part by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, Department of State, a partner agency of the National Endowment for the Arts, through a grant administered by the Union County Office of Cultural and Heritage Affairs.

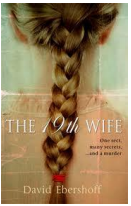

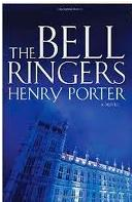

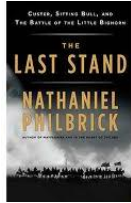
